1. Have you contacted your Local Council to hear about their support?

2. Have you checked if there is anything that can be done about your energy bill?

Speak with your energy provider to check that you are on the lowest rate possible. Have a look at the meter in your home. It has a unique registration number. Check that the number on your meter matches the number on your bill (this is different to your customer number). Talk to your energy provider as many companies will provide a discount for vulnerable families. It is helpful to call your energy provider to inform them of your living situation, detailing the needs within your household.

3. Did you know that we have a food bank that all families of Shooting Star Children's Hospices can access?

4. Did you know that community hubs have money they can distribute?

Lions Charity is a nationwide scheme which forms community hubs to respond to a rising need within the local community. There are currently over 600 nationwide. Contact your local Lion Charity to ask whether there are any local schemes that could support you.

Organisations are hosting sessions for families to spend time together for free in a warm space. If it is too expensive for your family to run the heating at home this winter, consider finding a safe space where you could complete homework, charge devices, meet with others and eat together.

11. Have you informed your Social Worker?

We urge you to inform your Social Worker of the specific difficulties that you are facing.

12. Have you made a charity application?

Charlie & Carter Foundation can provide up to two months of support for bills/rent etc. The criteria is:

- The sick child must be diagnosed with a life-limiting condition confirmed in writing from a medical professional
- The parent/s must care for the sick child up to 16 years old
- One of the parents must have had to leave their job or reduce working hours to care for their child

- League of the Helping Hand: help those who are living on a very low income, receiving the appropriate welfare benefits and who have exhausted all other funding sources including statutory funding, occupational, local and specialist charities.
